There's a negative and positive way to do that. There are positive phrases to use to help students do what we ask in a positive way.

Negative: "Do you need help?"

Positive: I am here to help you if you need me.

Negative: I explained this to you already.

Positive: Maybe I can show you another way.

Negative: Do I need to separate you?

Positive: Could you use a Break?

Negative: We don't talk like that.

Positive: Please use kind words.

YOUR WORDS MATTER
